(ALL Full-fashion) after Rows 130, 131, 132, 133, 135, 136 139, 140, 143 152, 161, 164, 176, 179, 188, then knit to Row 212.

Work Short Rows for the Bust Dart. ON OPPOSITE SIDE of CAM BOX put into holding position 5 needles after Rows 91, 93, 95, 97, 99, 101, 103. After Row 105 bring all needles back into working position. Make buttonholes after Row 110, then knit to Row 119.
Make buttonholes after Rows in (). INCREASE 2 sts. for the Dart AND 1 st. ON CAM BOX SIDE, after Rows 26, 38 , Row 91

ROWS 0 to 26: ON CAM BOX SIDE cast on 22 sts. after Row 13 AND make buttonholes after Row 20 over the 2nd-6th and 17th-21st sts.

Cast on 56 sts. and work stockinette st.


Work 3 more sections the same.
ROWS 273 to 320: Knit even, then bind off the remaining 57 sts.
ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st . after Rows 88, 98, 108, 118, 126, 134, 142 150, 158, 166, 174, 182, 190, 198, 206 $214,222,230,238,246,254,262,270$, then knit to Row 272.
ROWS 0 to 88: Knit even.
Cast on 103 sts. and work stockinette st.

## DK 7826

SIZE 10/12. MATERIAL: 21 oz. (12 balls) black KNITKING Subita Crepe $2 \times 4$, Color No. 16 and 5 yards red rick rack trimming. TENSION: KNITKING 6 to 8 . STITCH GAUGE: 16 sts. $2^{\prime \prime}, 22$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$. PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. Make ALL shapings of 1 st. Full-fashion. DECREASES: After Rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate sides onto the $2 n d$ st. then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. INCREASES: After Rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. on the appropriate sides 1 needle outward, then place the 3 rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle. Begin the Dart by hanging the sts. marked on the diagram together, then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needles. The following decreases for the dart lie directly above.
FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. SKIRT: Weave the sections together, 1 st . in on each edge, leaving a $9^{\prime \prime}$ opening on the left side for the zipper. Make a narrow hem around the opening. Turn under 24 rows on upper edge, hem to wrong side and insert an elastic band. Sew 2 rows of rick rack trimming to waist band, (see picture). Sew in zipper. Turn under 22 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. BOLERO: Join front and back sections at sides and shoulders. Turn under a small amount on ALL edges. Sew rick rack trimming around edges (See picture).



Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 168 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Rows 84,$85 ; 3$ sts. after Rows 86 , 87, 88, 89: 2 sts. after Rows 90, 91, 92, 93. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st . after Rows 94, 96, 98, 112, 126, 140, 154. needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.

ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 14, 26, 38, 50, 62, 74, then knit to Row 84.
ROWS 0 to 14: K nit even.
Cast on 134 sts. and work stockinette st.


Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT SIDE at Row 0).
ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. after Rows $168,170,172 ; 7$ sts. after Rows 174, 176.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts. after Row 84 (EVEN ROWS = ARM HOLE SHAPING); 1 st. after Row 85 (ODD ROWS = NECKSHAPING):3 sts. after Row 86; 1 st. after Row 87; 3 sts. after Row 88; 1 st . after Row 89; 2 sts. after Rows 90, 92; 1 st. after Rows 93, 94, 96, 97, 98, 101, 105, 109, 112, 113, 117, 121, 125, 126, 129, 133, 137, 140 141, 145, 149, 153, 154, 157, 161, 165 then knit to Row 168.
ROWS 0 to 84: ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX put into holding position 48 needles, then knit 2 rows. Bring back into working position 8 needles after Rows 2, 4;5 needles after Rows 6, 8; 3 needles after Rows $10,12,14$; (14) 2 needles after Rows 16, 18, 20, 22; 1 needle after Rows $24,26,(26), 28,30$, 32. (all needles are now in working position). Continue to increase 1 st . ON CAM BOX SIDE after Rows $38,50,62$, 74, then knit to Row 84.

Cast on 70 sts. and work Short Rows. While working Short Rows, make INCREASES of 1 st. ON CAM BOX SIDE after Rows in ().

SIZE: 12/14. MATERIAL: 14 oz . ( 8 balls) white $31 / 2 \mathrm{oz}$. ( 2 balls) turquoise, $13 / 4 \mathrm{oz}$. ( 1 ball) black and $13 / 4 \mathrm{oz}$. ( 1 ball) yellow KNITKING Subita Crepe $2 \times 3$, Color Nos. 104, 154, 116 and 139 TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6 . STITCH GAUGE: 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime}, 24$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$. PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch and Norwegian Design according to Line Drawing, or use JAC 40 and Pattern No. 404. In the directions, each row in the Norwegian Design is counted as 1 row, but several movements of the Cam Box are needed to complete 1 row. EDGES and COLLAR: K1, P1, Ribbing. Make all decreases for Raglan Shaping and increases for Sleeves Full-fashion. DECREASES: A fter Rows indicated hang the 3 rd and 4 th sts. on the appropriate sides onto the 5 th and 6 th sts., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needles. INCREASES: After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. ON EACH SIDE, 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.
FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. Join front and back sections at sides. Sew sleeves together, then weave to front and back section, 1 st. in on each edge. Join short ends of collar. Sew 1 edge of collar to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.



Work the second sleeve with reverse shaping, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT SIDE at Row 0).

After Row 318 bring all needles back into working position, then bind off the remaining 16 sts.
ROWS 71 to 194: ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st . after Rows 72, 80, 88, 94, $100,106,112,118,124,130,136,142$, $148,154,160,166,170,174,178,182$, 186, 190, then knit to Row 194.

ROWS 27 to 70: Work the Norwegian Design AND ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 32, 40, 48, 56 and 64. After Row 70 continue with white and work stockinette st.
ROWS 17 to 26: Work stockinette st. AND ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 16 and 24, then knit to Row 26.

ROWS 0 to 16: Work K1, P1, Ribbing, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine.
Cast on 78 sts. with turquoise.


Cast on 166 sts. with white and work 62 rows K1, P1, Ribbing, then bind off all sts. the crochet method for ribbing.

Change to tension 4 and set the Gate Cam Release Lever on both Knitter and Ribber to the needle heels. Knit in Brioche Rib to Row 164. Change to Row 192, then bind off the crochet method for ribbing.

SIZE: 6-7 (Chest 25"-26"). MATERIAL: Main Color, $83 / 4 \mathrm{oz}$. ( 5 balls) brown-blue KNITKING Subita Crepe with Rayon; Accent Color, $13 / 4 \mathrm{oz}$. (1 ball) brown KNITKING Subita Crepe $2 \times 3$, Color Nos. 269 and 127. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6. STITCH GAUGE: Stockinette Stitch 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime}, 23$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$ : K1, P1, Ribbing 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime} 25$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$ PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1 Ribbing. Make increases on sleeves Full-fashion After Rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. ON EACH SIDE, 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.
FINISHING: Block all sections to measurements given. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Join short ends of neckband. Sew 1 edge of neckband to inside and 1 edge to outside of neckline.


Cast on 140 sts. with accent color and work 40 rows $\mathrm{K} 1, \mathrm{P} 1$, Ribbing, then bind off the crochet method for ribbing.


Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 160 and omplete the left half. Follow the in structions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 6 sts. (5 sts. for the left half) after Row 161 ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 3 sts after Rows 163, 165; 2 sts. after Rows 175, 177, 1 st. after Rows 171, 173 , fter Rows $182,184,186$ (EVEN 4 sts. SHOULDER SHAPING): 5 RIS Siss Rows 188, 190, 192.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. fter Rows 122, 123, 124, 125; 2 sts. after Rows 126, 127, 128, 129; 1 st. fter Rows 130, 131, 132, 133, 134 135, 136, 137. Now knit to Row 160, then put 47 needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right hal f first.
ROWS 21 to 122: Knit even.
ROWS 0 to 20: Work K1, P1, Ribbing, then transfer the ribber sts, to the main machine, change to main color and work tockinette st.
Cast on 123 sts. with accent color.


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts after Rows 130, 131; 3 sts. after Rows 132, 133, 134, 135; 2 sts. after Rows 136, 137, 138, 139, 140, 141; 1 st. after Rows 142, 143, 2 sts. after Rows 144, 145; 1 st. after Rows 146, 147; 2 sts. after Rows 148, 149; 1 st. after Rows 150, 151; 2 sts. after Rows 152, 153; 1 st. after Rows 154, 155; 2 sts. after Rows 156, 157; 1 st. after Rows 158, 159; 2 sts. after Rows 160, 161, 162, 163; 3 sts. after Rows 164, 165, 166, 167; 10 sts. after Row 168.
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 20, 28, 36, 44, 52, 60, 68, 76, 84, 92, 100, 108, 116, 124, then knit to Row 130.
ROWS 0 to 20: Work K1, P1, Ribbing, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine, change to main color and work stockinette st.
Cast on 60 sts. with accent color

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 182 and complete the left half. Follow tie instructions from

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 182 (EVEN ROWS $=$ SHOULDER SHAPING); 9 sts. ( 8 sts. for the left half) after Row 183 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAPING); 4 sts. after Rows 184, 185, 186, 187; 5 sts. after Row 188; 2 sts. after Row 189; 5 sts. after Row 190; 2 sts. after Row 191; 5 sts. after Row 192

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 122, 123, 124, 125; 2 sts. after Rows 126, 127, 128, 129; 1 st. after Rows 130, 131, 132, 133, 134, 135, 136, 137. Now knit even to Row 182, then put 47 needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.
ROWS 21 to 122: Knit even.
ROWS 0 to 20: Work K1, P1, Ribbing, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine, change to main color and work stockinette st.
Cast on 123 sts. with accent color.

MK 5225

SIZE: 6-7 (Chest $25^{\prime \prime}-26^{\prime \prime}$ ). MATERIAL: Main Color 14 oz . ( 8 balls) red-blue KNITKING Subita Crepe with Rayon; Accent Color $1 \% / 4$ oz. ( 1 ball ) red KNITKING Subita Crepe $2 \times 3$, Color Nos. 268 and 110. TENSION: KNITKING 4 to 6 . STITCH GAUGE: Stockinette Stitch 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime}, 23$ rows $2^{\prime \prime \prime}$ K1, P1, Ribbing 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime}, 25$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$
PATTERN: Stockinette Stitch. EDGES: K1, P1 Ribbing. DECREASES for Side Seam: After rows indicated, hang the 3rd st. on the appropriate sides onto the 2 nd st., then move the end sts. inward to fill the empty needle. INCREASES for Sleeves: After rows indicated, move the 2 end sts. ON EACH SIDE 1 needle outward, then place the 3rd st. from the row below onto the empty needle.
FINISHING: TUNIC: Block all sections to measurements given. Join front and back section at sides and shoulders. Sew sleeves together and set in. Turn under 20 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Sew pockets to tunic. Join neckbands at center back, then sew 1 edge to inside and 1 edge to outside of front edges and neckline, leaving 4 openings on the right front edge for buttonholes. Finish buttonholes, sew on buttons. CAP: Join cap at hem back. Torn und 10 rows on lower edge and hem to wrong side. Puil open sts. on top of cap together and fasten loose ends of yarn. Make a
Pom-Pom and sew to center top of cap.


ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. fter Rows 130, 131; 3 sts. after Rows 132, 133, 134, 135; 2 sts. after Rows Rows 142, 143; 2 sts. after Rows 144 , 145; 1 st. after Rows 146, 147; 2 sts. after Rows 148, 149; 1 st. after Rows 150, 151; 2 sts. after Rows 152, 153; 1 st. after Rows 154, 155; 2 sts. after Rows 156, 157; 1 st. after Rows 158 , 59; 2 sts. after Rows 160, 161, 162 163; 3 sts. after Rows 164, 165, 166 67; 10 sts. after Row 168.
ON EACH SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 20, 28, 36, 44, 52, 60, 68, 76, 84 R2, 100, 108, 116,124 , 68, 76,84 , Row 130.

ROWS 0 to 20: Work K1, P1, Ribbing, then transfer the ribber sts. to the main machine, change to main color and work stockinette st.
Cast on 60 sts. with accent color.

Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 148 and complete the left half. Follow the in structions from *.
ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts after Row 205 (ODD ROWS $=$ NECK SHAPING); 3 sts. after Rows 207, 209 2 sts. after Rows 211, 213, 215; 1 st. after Rows 217, 219, 221, 223 (last time 230 (EVEN ROWS $=$ SHOU, 228 SHAPING) 5 RTs. after Rows 232 234 236.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 166, 168; 2 sts. after Rows. 170, 172, 174; 1 st. after Rows 176, 178, then knit to Row 205.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Row 152, then knit to Row 166. ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows 56, 62, 68, 74, 80, 86, 92, 98 104, 110, 116, 122, 128, 134, 140, 146 Knit to Row 148, then put 62 sts. on the left side into holding position and com plete the right half first.
ROWS 0 to 56: K nit even.
Cast on 156 sts. with main color and work stockinette st.


Move the Cam Box to the left side, turn the Row Counter back to 226 and complete the left half. Follow the instructions from *.

* ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 4 sts. after Row 226 (EVEN ROWS $=$ SHOULDER SHAPING); 8 sts. after Row 227 (ODD ROWS = NECK SHAP. ING); 4 sts. after Rows 228, 229, 230, 231; 5 sts. after Row 232; 2 sts. after Row 233; 5 sts. after Row 234; 2 sts. after Row 235; 5 sts. after Row 236.
ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Rows 166, 167, 168, 169; 2 sts. after Rows 170, 171, 172, 173, 174, 175; 1 st. after Rows $176,177,178$,

179. Now knit to Row 226 , then put 47 needles on the left side into holding position and complete the right half first.
ON EACH SIDE, decrease 1 st. after Rows $56,62,68,74,80,86,92,98$, $104,110,116,122,128,134,140,146$ 152 , then knit to Row 166

ROWS 0 to 56: K nit even.
Cast on 156 sts. with main color and work stockinette st.

## MK 5225a

SIZE: 6-7. MATERIAL: 14 oz . ( 8 balls) KNITKING Subita Crepe $2 \times 3$, Color for Girl's slacks red, No. 110; Color for Boy's slacks brown, No. GAUGE: 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime} 23$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$ PATTERN. GAUGE: 17 sts. $2^{\prime \prime}, 23$ rows $2^{\prime \prime}$. PATTERN: Full-fashion INCREASES: After Rows indicated Full-fashion. INCREASES: After Rows indicated, needle outward, then place the 3rd st, from the row below onto the empty needle, DECREASES: After Rows indicated hang the 3rd st on the After Rowiate sides onto the 2nd st, then move the end sts, inward to fill the empty needle. Begin the DARTS by hanging the sts, marked on the diagram together, then mone ins, inward to fill the together, then Dart lie directly above.
FINISHING: Block sections to measurement given. Join front and back sections at sides. Sew leg seams together, then join sections at center back and center front, leaving a $5^{\prime \prime}$ opening on front seam for the zipper. Make a narrow hem around the opening, then sew in zipper. Turn under 14 rows on leg edges and 12 rows on upper edge and hem to wrong side. Insert an elastic band into upper hem. Finish buttonhole, sew on button.

Cast on 35 sts. with main color and work 32 rows stockinette st., then transfer every other st. to the ribber, change to accent color and work 10 rows K1, P1, Ribbing. After Row 42 bind off the crochet method for ribbing.


Work the second back section with reverse shapings, casting on from right to left. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT SIDE at Row 0).


Work Short Rows. ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF CAM BOX, put into holding position 5 needles after Rows $294,296,298$, 300, 302, 304, 306. After Row 308 bring all needles back into working position, knit even to Row 332, then bind off the remaining 53 sts.
Make INCREASES of 1 st. ON CAM BOX SIDE after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 5 sts, after Row 206. 3 sts. after Rows 208, 210; 2 sts. after Rows 212, (213), 214, 216; 1 st after Rows 218, 220, 222, 224, (225), 226, 228, 230, 234, (237), 238, 242, Row 246) (249) 250, 256, (2 sts, for Dart after Row 258) (261), 262 268 (2 sts, for DART after Row 270) (273) 274,280 ( 2 sts, for Dart after Row 282) (285), 286, 292, (2 sts, for Dart after Row 292), then knit to Row 294 ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 28, 29, 36, 39, 44, 49, 52, 59, 60, 68, 69, 76, 79, 84, 89, 92, 99, 100, 108 109, 116, 119, 124, 129, 132, 140, 141. $148,153,156,164,165,170,176,177$. 182, 188, 189, 194, 200, 201, then knit to Row 206
ROWS 0 to 28: K nit even.
Cast on 51 sts. and work stockinette st.


Work the second front section with reverse shapings, casting on from left to right. (Cam Box will be on the RIGHT SIDE at Row 0). Omit the buttonholes ON CAM BOX SIDE, cast on 14 sts. after Row 294, make buttonholes after Rows 300 and 312 over the 6 th -10th sts., then knit to Row 318 and bind off the remaining 69 sts.
Make INCREASES of 1 st. ON CAM BOX SIDE after Rows in (). ON CAM BOX SIDE, bind off 3 sts. after Row 206; 2 sts, after Rows 208, ( 209), 210 220, 222 st. after Rows 214, 216, 218, or the DART fter Rows 260 , or the DART after Rows 260, 268 , (275), 276, 284, 292, then knit to Row 294.

ON CAM BOX SIDE, increase 1 st. after Rows 28, 29, 36, 44, 47, 52, 60, 65, 68 $76,83,84,92,100,101,108,116,119$ 124, 132, 137, 140, 148, 155, 156, 164 170, 173, 176, 182, 188, 191, 194, 200, then knit to Row 206.
ROWS 0 to 28: Knit even.
From right to left, cast on 41 sts. and work stockinette st. (Cam Box will be on the LEFT side at Row 0 )

## UNFAIR COMMENT

Although we, perhaps, have greater opportunities than other merchandisers of knitting machines to make comparisons between various brands, we refrain from doing so unless unfair comment is made in regard to KNITKING products... We are aware that various brands of knitting machines (like various brands of sewing machines) have certain features that appeal to individual purchasers... It would be foolish to think otherwise... But, value for money always has to be considered and we believe that KNITKING provides value and services that no other knitting machine company begins to approach.

A nationally distributed needlework magazine publishes a column on machine knitting by a writer named Lucile who uses the column to sell certain brands of Japanese made machines and their allied products... In her January 1970 column she refers to a letter from a reader that says "I have sent for brochures on several different kinds of knitting machines, how come such a difference in price ....?" Lucile replies "You are right, the price range is unbelievable and very confusing...." and she continues as follows....
"Now then, just because a machine has a big price tag on it, does not mean that it really is that much better than another one. Sometimes you are paying dearly for a beautiful two page color advertisement in a national magazine. On the other hand a bargain price machine may mean that it is a standard model without the features you really want.....
"The thing to do is figure out what you want a machine to do for you and then buy in the price range that you can afford. You can hardly go wrong as long as you stay in the medium price range, after all, you want to have enough money left to buy yarn so that you can use it..."

Since KNITKING is the only knitting machine company that has beautiful two page color advertising, we feel compelled to acquaint our readers with the true facts... First we would say that we have met Lucile and that in addition to visiting our offices, we have corresponded with her. In one of her letters dated March 29th, 1966, she says "I am a subscriber to your magazine and like it very much, although I do not use a KNITKING machine, I have made many of the garments and find the patterns excellent. That is why I would like to recommend your magazine and especially your yarns, to others who may not be acquainted with your publication. Will you give me your permission?"

We told Lucile that permission would be granted if she informed us ahead of time just what material from KNITKING MAGAZINE she would like to use... Since that time, she has entered into knitting machine selling and is offering Japanese knitting machines. We believe as a consequence, she has refrained from mentioning KNITKING products and services... we can understand this because any such comment would create interest in products other than those she is selling... but we object
most strenuously to any comment that we consider detrimental to our name or products.

Our first rebuttal to the article is in regard to prices of machines and we ask what is meant by "medium priced...?" The 200 needle machines offered for sale by Lucile sell for $\$ 195.00$, $\$ 219.95$ and $\$ 279.95$ without ribbing attachments. With a ribbing attachment, the latter machine sells for \$369.90... The finest KNITKING knitter without ribbing attachment sells for $\$ 299.00$... with a ribbing attachment, it is $\$ 399.00$.

Let us now analyze the statement "Sometimes you are paying dearly for a beautiful two page color advertisement..." The machines that Lucile offers for $\$ 195.00$ and $\$ 219.95$ without ribbers both have export prices around $\$ 40.00$. The importers sell them to their dealers at $\$ 100.00$ or less per machine... and the dealer makes a profit of $100 \%$ or more. The markup from export price to selling price is as much as $550 \%$...!! If we had the same percentage markup on KNITKING machines, we would have to offer our best machine at a price approach ing $\$ 800.00 .!!!!$ Every product that is sold successfully needs to be advertised successfully and like most corporations, we allocate a certain percentage of the profits from each sale to advertising, but because we choose to do it tastefully and in color does not necessarily mean that our customers are paying dearly for it.

Now, let's refer to the paragraph that says "On the other hand, a bargain price machine may mean that it is a standard model without the features you really want." The three best selling nationally advertised Japanese made machines at the time of writing are the Studio, the Brothers and the Genie... they are all automatic... 200 needle knitting machines of fairly comparable quality.....During 1969 the retail price of the Studio 303 in Japan was 27,500 yen which is the equivalent of $\$ 76.18 \ldots$ its price in the U.S. was $\$ 219.95 \ldots$ the Brothers 585 sold in Japan for 28,000 yen ( $\$ 77.56$ ) ... its price in the U.S. varied between $\$ 195.00$ and $\$ 230.00 \ldots$ The Genie 1500 sold in Japan for 28,500 yen $(\$ 78.95) \ldots$ its price in the U.S. was $\$ 79.50 \ldots$ We leave our readers to decide what among the Japanese made machines is the best value for money... and whether or not she can go wrong by buying in the so-called "medium price range".. and how much money she can save with which to buy yarn.

We endeavor to provide a complete service to the knitting machine owner... we are confident that we have the finest knitting machine in the world (a fact surely confirmed by the 5 gold medal awards for excellence won by KNITKING machines)... The superior quality and low prices of our exclusive KNITKING YARNS is readily acknowledged by our thousands of users... and of course there is beautiful KNITKING MAGAZINE and other excellent KNITKING publications.

Imagine a discount of $75 \%$... silly, isn't it?...but true nevertheless... ## STITCH AND ROW GAUGE

KNIT A SAMPLE SWATCH . . . before you begin to knit any garment . . . for this is the MOST IMPORTANT STEP toward the correct size and the proper fit of any garment you wish to make. You MUST use the SAME YARN for your sample swatch that you will use to knit your garment and your sample swatch must be knitted large enough and using several different tension numbers on your machine. When you have done this, then you can determine the number of stitches and the number of rows in a two-inch measure. KNITKING MAGAZINE PATTERNS give you 3 tensions to try and one of them should give you the correct stitch and row gauge if you are using the yarn we recommend or a similar weight yarn. Here is the way to make your sample swatch.

Cast on over a sufficient number of needles to produce a swatch at least 4 inches wide. (If the pattern calls for 16 stitches to $2^{\prime \prime}$, then $16 \times 2=32$ stitches to cast on). Now knit 4 inches of rows at the first suggested tension number. (If the pattern calls for 22 rows to $2^{\prime \prime}, 22 \times 2=44$ rows to knit). Knit 2 rows using a contrast color, change to the next higher tension and with garment yarn knit another $4^{\prime \prime}$, knit 2 rows with contrast color, change to the 3rd higher tension and knit another $4^{\prime \prime}$ and then bind off.

Roll the swatch into a cylinder over its length and pull on both ends, unroll it and stretch it diagonally by pulling on the four corners. Allow the swatch to rest and settle (preferably overnight) and then using a stitch gauge or a ruler, count the number of stitches over a $2^{\prime \prime}$ width, then the number of rows over a $2^{\prime \prime}$ length in EACH of the 3 tensions. Select the tension number that produces the stitches and rows called for in the pattern. If none of them are correct, you are most likely using the wrong weight of yarn.

## READING OF CHARTS

You will notice the instructions start at the bottom of the Chart and work UP. Follow the charts exactly as written and providing your sample stitch and row gauge is correct, your garment will come out the right size. Please remember that the section of garment as it is knitted on the machine, faces
the same way as the Charts are in this magazine. Where two front pieces are needed, (or any other part of a garment that needs two sections) only one section is normally shown and the second section is sometimes made with reverse shaping. Set in sleeves are usually identical, but raglan sleeves have to be knitted with reverse shaping for the second sleeve.

## READING OF SYMBOLS

Symbols are used on Line Drawings of Pattern stitches to show the position of the needles and the variety of stitches used for Pattern knitting. These Symbols are drawn and are to be read as you look at them while knitting the garment. For instance: if a Purl stitch faces you, the Purl stitch Symbol $\prod$ is shown; if a knit stitch faces you (as when using the ribber) then this Symbol $\square$ is shown. The Line Drawings for pattern stitches are to be read and set up on your machine from RIGHT to LEFT unless otherwise stated in the individual instructions.
In EYELET design Patterns
 specified stitches are transferred to an adjacent needle and the empty needles are returned to the working position. The drawings have row numbers on the RIGHT side. Missing Row Numbers are ALWAYS knitted straight or plain.
In HOLDING POSITION DESIGNS $\bullet$ selected needles are pushed into holding position for the stated number of rows. The numbers of rows appear at the right of the Line Drawings. Example: 1-4 means knit rows 1 to 4;5-7 means knit rows 5 to $7 ; 8-12$ means knit rows 8 to 12, etc. etc. (See below for more Pattern Stitch Symbols.)

## BLOCKING and ASSEMBLING GARMENTS

Block each section of your knitting separately BEFORE assembling any garment. This not only makes putting your garment together much easier but gives it that professional look of perfection. For the correct assembly of garments and all other important information regarding machine knitting, refer to our book " Practical Knitting Hints."

## PATTERN STITCH SYMBOLS

$=$ knit stitch
= purl stitch

$=2$ stitches on 1 needle either transferred from the right side or the left side, then put the needle into holding position
= empty needle (leave in working position)

$=$ needle in the holding positon
= needle not used (in the out of work position)
$=$ needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the LEFT

$=$ needle holding 2 stitches. Stitch has been transferred from the RIGHT

$=3$ stitches on 1 needle. The 1st and 3rd stitch in a group of 3 needles has been hung on the 2 nd or center needle.

The diagrams (Line Drawings) for pattern work are followed just as they are shown and are to be read as you look at them while knitting the garment.
